Famous Christian

St Francis of Assisi

(c.1181 – 1226)

Saint Francis of Assisi was an Italian religious leader born in the 12th century, known for founding the Franciscan Order. He gave up a life of wealth to serve the poor and live simply. Francis showed generosity by caring for the sick, helping those in need, and treating all living creatures with kindness and compassion.

2 Corinthians 8: 1-4

In the Bible, in 2 Corinthians, Christian giving is explained by the Apostle Paul:

“And now, brothers, we want you to know about the grace that God gave the churches in Macedonia. They have been tested by great troubles. And they are very poor. But they gave much because of their great joy. I can tell you that they gave as much as they were able. They gave even more than they could afford. No one told them to do it.”

It explains that you don't have to be rich to be kind and generous. Even a little help, given with love, is very special. What could you do to show generosity? Do you think being rich matters?
